(USNA '91), *Senior Director for Finance, Global Foundries*

CFO for the multi-billion dollar Singapore operations of Global Foundries, the #2 global semiconductor foundry. Reporting to the Global CFO, Dan partners with the Singapore General Manager to drive growth initiatives, manufacturing efficiencies, and strategic projects aimed at achieving the site's performance objectives. He has direct or matrix responsibility for all finance functions including operations finance, tax, treasury, FP&A, and accounting. Dan is also a Board member for several Global Foundries joint ventures and subsidiaries. Prior to Global Foundries, Dan was a Managing Director at MKM Partners, where he was responsible for the firm's semiconductor equity research coverage. All told, Dan spent a decade on Wall Street in various analyst and leadership roles. He has extensive investment experience across the semiconductor space and was the founding Director of Research for a startup broker/dealer.



General Vincent Brooks

(USMA '80), *Commander, U.S. Army Pacific*

Commands U.S. Army Pacific (USARPAC), with responsibility for all U.S. Army forces and activities in the strategically important Indo-Asia Pacific region assigned to the United States Pacific Command (USPACOM). A 1980 graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point, he was selected to serve as the Cadet Brigade Commander or "First Captain" of the U.S. Corps of Cadets – the top ranking position for a cadet at West Point, and the first African American to be selected for this position in West Point's history. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the United States Military Academy; a Master of Military Art and Science from the School of Advanced Military Studies at the United States Army Command and General Staff College; and an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree from the New England School of Law in Boston.



Mr. Alexander Feldman

President & CEO, US-ASEAN Business Council

President & CEO of the US-ASEAN Business Council. Founded in 1984, the Council represents more than 150 of the largest American businesses in Southeast Asia through its headquarters in Washington, DC and its seven regional offices. Since Mr. Feldman assumed his role in June of 2009, the Council has grown its membership by nearly 70%, added two new regional offices, and established major initiatives such as ASEAN Matters for America, the US-ASEAN Business Alliance for Competitive SMEs, an annual CEO level business mission to ASEAN, and the ASEAN Economic Ministers Roadshow. Mr. Feldman has been involved in the ASEAN region for over 25 years in a career spanning both the public and private sectors. He resided in Asia for more than a decade, and has conducted business in all 10 ASEAN countries.

(USMA '79), *President, Be The Change*

President and member of the executive board for Be the Change, Inc. – a social impact organization that spearheads national-based campaigns to scale positive social change in American society. Mr. Gordon was appointed in the Obama Administration as the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Community and Family Policy, where he was awarded the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service. Mr. Gordon served as an artillery officer, aide-de-camp to General Colin Powell, and head of American Politics at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. He also served in the Bush Administration as the Special Assistant to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and in the Clinton Administration as the Director of Special Operations, Office of National Service, The White House.



Mr. Ho Kwon Ping

Executive Chairman, Banyan Tree Holdings

Executive Chairman of Banyan Tree Holdings, which owns both listed and private companies engaged in the development, ownership and operation of hotels, resorts, spas, residential homes, retail galleries and other lifestyle activities around the world. Ho Kwon Ping was educated in Tunghai University, Taiwan; Stanford University, California and the University of Singapore. In May 2000, Mr. Ho was conferred an honorary doctorate by Johnson & Wales University, and later received the London Business School 2005 Entrepreneurship Award. In 2009, he was the recipient of the Hospitality Lifetime Achievement Award at the China Hotel Investment Summit in Shanghai. In 2010, he became the first Asian to receive the ACA (American Creativity Association) Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of his creativity and innovation in various spheres of endeavour.



Captain H. B. Le

(USNA '92), *Deputy Commodore, DESRON 7, U.S. Navy*

Captain H. B. Le is a native of Hue, Vietnam and attended Gar-Field Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia. At sea, Captain Le served as auxiliaries officer and first lieutenant in USS Ticonderoga (CG 47), fire control officer in USS Wasp (LHD 1), weapons officer and combat systems officer in USS Hue City (CG 66), executive officer in USS Curtis Wilbur (DDG 54), and commanding officer, USS Lassen (DDG 82). During his command tour, Lassen won the Battle "E" Award for 2009 and Association of Old Crows Outstanding Navy Unit Award for 2010. He has served on the staffs of U.S. 2nd Fleet and U.S. Joint Forces Command and as executive assistant to two commanders, U.S. 7th Fleet. He most recently served as junior military assistant to the secretary of defense and reported in January 2015 to Destroyer Squadron Seven as deputy commander.

LG Ng was appointed Chief of Defence Force on 27 March 2013. A fighter pilot by vocation, LG Ng held various key command and staff appointments over 28 years of service. These included Commanding Officer, 144 Squadron; Commander, Changi Air Base; Deputy Head, Joint Communications and Information Systems Department; Head Air Plans Department; Director Joint Operations; and Deputy Chief of Air Force. He also held the concurrent appointment as Military Private Secretary to the Minister for Defence from December 1995 to July 1996. In his last appointment as the Chief of Air Force, LG Ng led the Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) to a high level of operational readiness and built on the successful Third Generation RSAF transformation.



Grace Park

(USMA '94), *Co-Founder & Executive Chairman, DocDoc*

Co-Founder and Executive Chairwoman of DocDoc, Asia's largest doctor discovery portal. She brings with her more than 18 years of leadership experience, nearly 13 of which were spent in international healthcare when she led large-scale teams of distributors and a direct-to-doctor, pan-Asian sales force for Fortune 500 companies. Prior to DocDoc, Grace held leadership positions at Medtronic, most recently as the Managing Director for its ASEAN operations, leading the company to expand its footprint for medical technology in these markets. Over the years, she has also worked in companies such as Bristol-Myers Squibb to market its innovative medicines in the United States, Africa, and the Asia-Pacific region.

Benson Peretti graduated from the United States Merchant Marine Academy in 2004 and sailed for seven years aboard container ships, rising to the rank of Chief Mate. Benson continues to serve in the Navy Reserve as a Lieutenant Commander, drilling with Military Sealift Command Far East as a Strategic Sealift Officer. Noni obtained her Bachelor of Engineering from University of Newcastle, Australia and earned her Master of Business Administration (Finance and Marketing) from University of San Francisco, USA in 1997. Her role in Blue Bird Transportation division was to set up the business development, public relations, quality control, IT departments and improved the marketing system of the Blue Bird Group, which includes Blue Bird Taxi, Silver Bird Executive Taxi, Golden Bird Limousine and Car Rental and Big Bird Charter Bus in Indonesia. Blue Bird now boasts around 34,000 vehicles and 38,500 drivers. She is recently voted as one of The 2015 Forbes Asia Power Businesswomen by Forbes Asia.



Mr. Fidel Ramos

(USMA '50), The 12th President of the Philippines

Remembered for his ability to lead and willingness to serve the people, Mr. Ramos promoted the principles of people empowerment and was responsible for implementing a comprehensive Social Reform Agenda (SRA) that addressed long-standing national problems. Per capita income of the Filipino family grew more during his administration than in the preceding two decades. He won the coveted 1997 UNESCO Peace Prize – the first for Asians and his public service spanned a total period of 51 years having served as Secretary of National Defense and Chief of Staff of the Armed Forces of the Philippines with the rank of General (4 Stars). Ever the international diplomat and Philippine cheerleader, he personally interacts with many leaders in various strategic and intellectual fora around the world.



Mr. Simon Tay

Chairman, Singapore Institute of International Affairs

Chairman of the Singapore Institute of International Affairs, the country's oldest think tank and founding member of the ASEAN network of think-tanks. An independent, civic institution, the SIIA was ranked by an international survey as No 1 in ASEAN for 2013 and 2014 and advised the Myanmar government on its ASEAN chairmanship in 2014. He is concurrently Associate Professor, teaching international law at the National University of Singapore, whose law school is rated in the top 10 globally. He has also taught as a visiting professor at Yale University, the Fletcher School and Harvard Law School. Prof Tay is also Senior Consultant at WongPartnership, a leading Asian law firm that practices across the region, with offices in Singapore, China and the Middle East, and practices that cover ASEAN.

Sworn in as the United States Ambassador to the Republic of Singapore on September 4, 2013. Previously Managing Partner of Wagar Law, P.A. – a Miami-based law firm that focused on contract and insurance litigation. He served on the Sub-Saharan Africa Advisory Committee of the Export-Import Bank in 2010, and on the full Ex-Im Bank Advisory Committee for the 2011 and 2012 terms. Mr. Wagar was the Florida Finance Chair for President Obama and a trustee of the inaugural committee in 2009 and 2013, and also served as Florida Finance Chair for the Democratic National Committee for John Kerry's 2004 presidential campaign. He has been a member of the boards of the American Association for Justice, the Florida Justice Association, and the National Collegiate Conference Association.



Mr. Yeoh Keat Chuan

Managing Director, Singapore Economic Development Board (EDB)
